

Open call for Experts to represent SMEs in standardisation Technical Committees/Sub-Committees/Working Groups in CEN, CENELEC, ETSI and ISO and IEC

Applying individuals and supporting organisations are invited to read the whole call before applying.

The appointment of experts is contingent on the approval of the 2019 Work Programme and budget as well as the signature of the annual Operating Grant by the European Commission and on the decision of the governing bodies of SBS.

Small Business Standards (SBS) has been selected by the European Commission as the organisation to represent SMEs in the standardisation process. In this framework, SBS is launching an open call for experts with the objective to appoint experts to represent the interests of SMEs in Technical Committees (TCs), Sub-Committees (SCs) and Working Groups (WGs) of CEN, CENELEC, ETSI, ISO and IEC. Experts will be appointed for one year. The appointment is renewable. This new call is co-funded by the European Commission and the European Free Trade Association (EFTA).

This call is open to candidates with technical expertise in any standardisation topic relevant for SMEs. Selected experts will develop a European SME position and be the representative of European SMEs in their TC/SC/WG. They will work as SME spokesperson and not as the representative of a single organisation/company/country.

Candidates shall be based in EU or EFTA countries. There are two types of contracts offered to experts:

- a contract between SBS and the SME supporting association (which may be but does not have to be the employer of the expert),
- a contract between SBS and the expert directly (independent experts).

Candidates and/or their supporting association shall indicate which type of contract they are seeking.

A. Selection criteria

The selection of experts will be based on the following criteria:

- proven knowledge of the subject within the scope of the TC/SC/WG Work Programme,
- proven knowledge of the standardisation system,
- SME or craft oriented background,
- excellent knowledge of English (written and verbal),
- good communication skills, computer literacy, willingness to travel.

Applications for TCs/SCs only are not admitted (unless the TC/SC has no WGs), they must also include at least one WG for each application to a TC or SC. However, applications for WGs only are possible.

Two or more experts cannot be appointed to the same body (TC, SC or WG). However, two or more experts can be appointed to different WGs under the same TC.

Candidates must specify, in their application, to which TC/SC(s)/WG(s) they wish to be appointed. An expert can be funded in one TC only, but may be selected to represent SBS in other TCs without funding.

B. Application

B.1 All applicants

All applicants are required to submit the following (see below for the special case of unfunded experts):

- letter on honour confirming the absence of conflict of interest and absence of double-funding, signed by the applicant,
- the list of meetings scheduled in 2019 of the TC/SC(s)/WG(s) for which appointment is sought (there have to be some meetings listed for the application to be considered; meetings yet to be confirmed, however, may be indicated as “TBC”),
- a letter signed by their SME organisation or by a recognised SME organisation (in the case of independent experts). The letter has to include:
 - support for the candidate’s application,
 - the TC, SC(s) and WG(s) for which the application is made,
 - justification for SMEs to be involved in the work of the TC/SC(s)/WG(s),
 - agreement to co-fund 11 % for experts contracted to an SME organisation (see Section C),
 - the status of the organisation (e.g. limited company),
 - the name, address and E-mail address of the contact person in the SME organisation.

Independent funded experts have to indicate their willingness to co-fund the 11 % themselves.

Candidates and/or their supporting association shall indicate which type of contract they are seeking (see page 1)

B.2 Re-applying experts

Experts re-applying are allowed to request nomination to a different TC/SC(s)/WG(s) than those attended in 2018, provided that the reason for such a change is explained.

B.3 New candidate experts

In addition to the information in B.1, new candidate experts have to submit the following:

- a detailed curriculum vitae,
- a covering letter highlighting qualifications, experience and SME background.

Preference is generally given to re-applying experts, so candidates should avoid TC(s)/SC(s)/WG(s) where SBS already has experts (see Annex 1). If a candidate does wish to apply for an occupied committee, however, they may do so. but a second TC/SC(s)/WG(s) may also be indicated if the candidate is willing to be nominated to the second preference.

B.4 Unfunded experts

SBS may also select experts to represent SME interests but without funding. An expert may be funded in one committee and unfunded in others, and the application requirements remain the same, except that the candidate has to clearly indicate the TC(s)/SC(s)/WG(s) where they are not seeking funding. Unfunded experts have to undertake the same work planning and reporting activities as funded experts.

C. Contract and co-funding

All funded experts appointed by SBS have to contribute a sum equal to 11 %, VAT exempt.

This contract will be valid for one year (2019) and the payment will be € 10 000 (contracts at European level) and € 19 000 (contracts at international level) VAT exempt. Thus, the co-funding contribution to be paid to SBS, by the supporting association or the expert, is € 1331 (contracts at European level) and € 2529 (contracts at international level), VAT included, if applicable. The co-funding sum has to be received by SBS before the expert contract can come into force.

D. Further information

SBS reserves the right to contact candidates and their organisations directly, if further information is required.

Incomplete or unclear applications risk being rejected. It is the responsibility of the applicant to supply all the information required, not for SBS to request it.

All applicants will be contacted once the selection process has been completed.
