

Standards are developed in an international system



BSI as the UK's National Standards Body post-EU exit

BSI continues to serve the standards needs of UK stakeholders

BSI works through membership of ISO, IEC, CEN, CENELEC and ETSI

SSI supports autonomous UK regulatory policy, providing the necessary mechanisms and sources of expertise to deliver UK government's needs for standards as they develop post-transition

Product regulation in UK from 1/1/21



- UKCA marking has replaced EU CE marking in Great Britain
- Northern Ireland continues to follow EU law, with CE marking harmonised standards cited in the OJEU continue to be used in NI for conformity purposes
- In Great Britain, new category of **'designated standards'**
- Designated by government, using a designated standard brings a legal advantage to the manufacturer – presumption of conformity



Designated standards in Great Britain

CA On 1/1/21 UK government designated all relevant harmonised European standards cited by the EU (over 3000 standards)

UK

- BSI's role is to support government to update the designation lists
- BSI provides information quarterly to the Business Department
- BSI online tools show which standards are designated (e.g. BSOL, BSI Shop)
- How UK government refers standards has changed their technical content has not



BSI's membership of CEN and CENELEC



BSI continues as CEN and CENELEC member, with voting rights of non-EEA member



Transition period for CEN and CENELEC statutes until 31/12/21



CEN and CENELEC members are developing a new model of membership for BSI, to be agreed June 2021
